# VIETNAM 50 YEARS

Each year on ANZAC Day, Horsham RSL Sub-Branch presents a brief outline of a significant event in Australian Military History, as part of our ANZAC Commemorative Services. Fifty years have now passed since the conclusion of the Australian Military presence in Vietnam, following the withdrawal of Australian Combat Units leaving only an Army Platoon guarding the Australian Embassy in Saigon.

So ended a 12-year involvement by Australian Military Units, including the Royal Australian Navy (RAN), Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF), and all nine Royal Australian Regiment (RAR) Battalions, that served in Vietnam on rotation.

At the peak of Australia's engagement, some 8,500 Australian Service Personnel were involved. These included Army Units, RAN Destroyers and Supply Ships, three RAAF Squadrons including Conscripts on active service with Australian Defence Forces for the first time. All worked closely with the United States of America, Military.

Much has been recorded about the significant Battle of Long Tan on 18 August 1966, where 108 Australian Troops held off an enemy force of over 2,000 in a four-hour battle that cost Australian casualties of 19 killed and 25 wounded. A feature of this battle was the significant contribution given by New Zealand and Australian artillery for close fire support of Australian troops. A true ANZAC battle. Today, on 18 August, the Nation commemorates "Vietnam Veterans Day".

The Wimmera/Horsham contribution to service in Vietnam consisted of 91 Young Men and one Young Lady Nurse, being 42 National Service Conscripts, with 50 Regular Australian Defence Force (ADF) Personnel. One Horsham Conscript, Private James (Jim) McMillan, was Killed in Action and today, as always, we honour his service and sacrifice. Private McMillan is remembered by his family and mates with the Horsham RSL Sub-Branch having named our Memorabilia Meeting Room "The McMillan Room" in his honour.

From 1961 to 1975, over 60,000 Australians, including Army, Navy, Airforce personnel and some civilians, including Salvation Army Officers, served in Vietnam. Casualties were 523 Killed and approximately 2,400 wounded. Today Vietnam Veterans number 35, 000, being the largest contingent of our National Veteran Community.
